Sports Premium 2015/2016

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding'. This funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

St. Paul's will receive £8000 plus £5 premium per pupil per annum. This funding will amount to £9050.
